### **Generative AI/ChatGPT in Scientific Research: Unveiling Biases and Discrimination**

ChatGPT and other large language models (LLMs) based tools offer diverse applications in scientific practice, supporting researchers with tasks like generating research ideas, conducting literature reviews, data summaries to even proposing new experiments.

Despite their potential to advance research, concerns arise about generative AI amplifying social inequalities in scientific findings. Moreover, high-income countries and privileged researchers with access to LLMs might exploit them to accelerate their own research and further widen inequalities.

In this workshop, we aim to raise awareness around the use of AI in scientific research, by understanding how these models work, identifying potential biases and ethical issues, and promoting competencies for a more responsible and transparent utilization.
